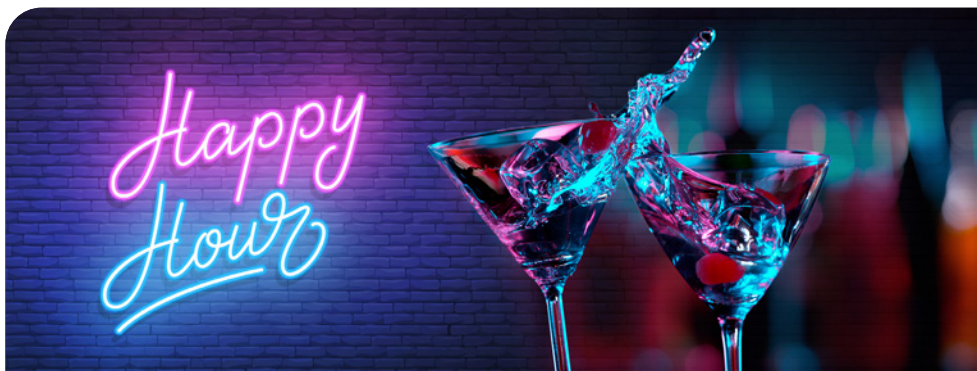

Sleep Disordered Breathing and Obstructive Sleep Apnea

Sleep-disordered breathing (SDB) is characterized by interruptions in breathing and airflow during sleep and includes diagnoses such as snoring, upper airway resistance syndrome and obstructive sleep apnea. A contemporary population-based study estimates that SDB affects 23.4% of women and 49.7% of men. SDB is independently associated with hypertension, diabetes, metabolic syndrome and depression. Dental sleep medicine has evolved significantly over the past decade, making it an ideal time to offer a course that goes well beyond oral appliance therapy.

For example, pediatric dentists involved in sleep and airway care have contributed significantly to the treatment of ankyloglossia through myofunctional therapy. Orthodontists collaborate with oral surgeons on maxillomandibular advancement procedures and with otolaryngologists on maxillary expansion. Maxillary expansion in pediatric and adult patients is one of the fastest-growing areas of clinical and academic dental sleep medicine. More notably, airway-focused dentists have become the de facto quarterbacks of sleep and airway health care in their local communities.

Calculus has long been a primary concern for hygienists, but other threats also prevent patients from improving their oral health. When more than half of U.S. adults and almost one-third of children have a chronic, life-threatening disease, it is important to understand the oral-systemic relationship. Clinical patients of all ages may have health issues involving the cognitive, metabolic, cardiovascular, respiratory and immune systems. These chronic inflammatory conditions make patients more susceptible to oral health decline and systemic overload. It's time to take action and learn strategies to help reduce inflammation, prevent oral decline, improve general well-being and possibly save a life.

Peri-Implantitis: How to Troubleshoot and Diagnose Problems

This course will review complications encountered with implant restorations, how to avoid potential food traps with implant crowns, why and how to avoid implant and restoration failures and the design of appropriate abutments and crowns. Attendees will learn to distinguish peri-mucositis from peri-implantitis, identify the factors that contribute to early and late implant failures and understand how implant placement, positioning and abutment selection affect long-term outcomes. Through clinical cases and radiographic reviews, attendees will also explore how lasers can aid in treatment and recognize common complications and strategies to help prevent them.

Know Your Orthodontics: Diagnosis, Case Selection and Treatment Pathways

This lecture is designed to enhance practitioners' fundamental knowledge of orthodontics. It covers essential orthodontic principles and practices, beginning with Andrews' Six Keys to Occlusion and the classification of malocclusion to provide a foundational understanding of occlusal relationships.

Attendees will learn to identify malocclusions and develop a strong understanding of orthodontic diagnosis and treatment. The course covers critical aspects of orthodontic records and diagnosis, which are vital to accurate treatment planning and sequencing. Practitioners will learn about interceptive orthodontics through Phase I cases and comprehensive orthodontic treatment strategies. They will also learn to recognize dental and skeletal problems that require interceptive, limited or comprehensive orthodontic treatment and identify simple cases that can be treated in their office versus more complex cases that should be referred to an orthodontist.

Overall, this course covers the management of orthodontic cases in pediatric and general dental practices. It is designed to equip practitioners with the knowledge and skills needed to excel in orthodontic diagnosis and treatment planning, helping them provide high-quality patient care.

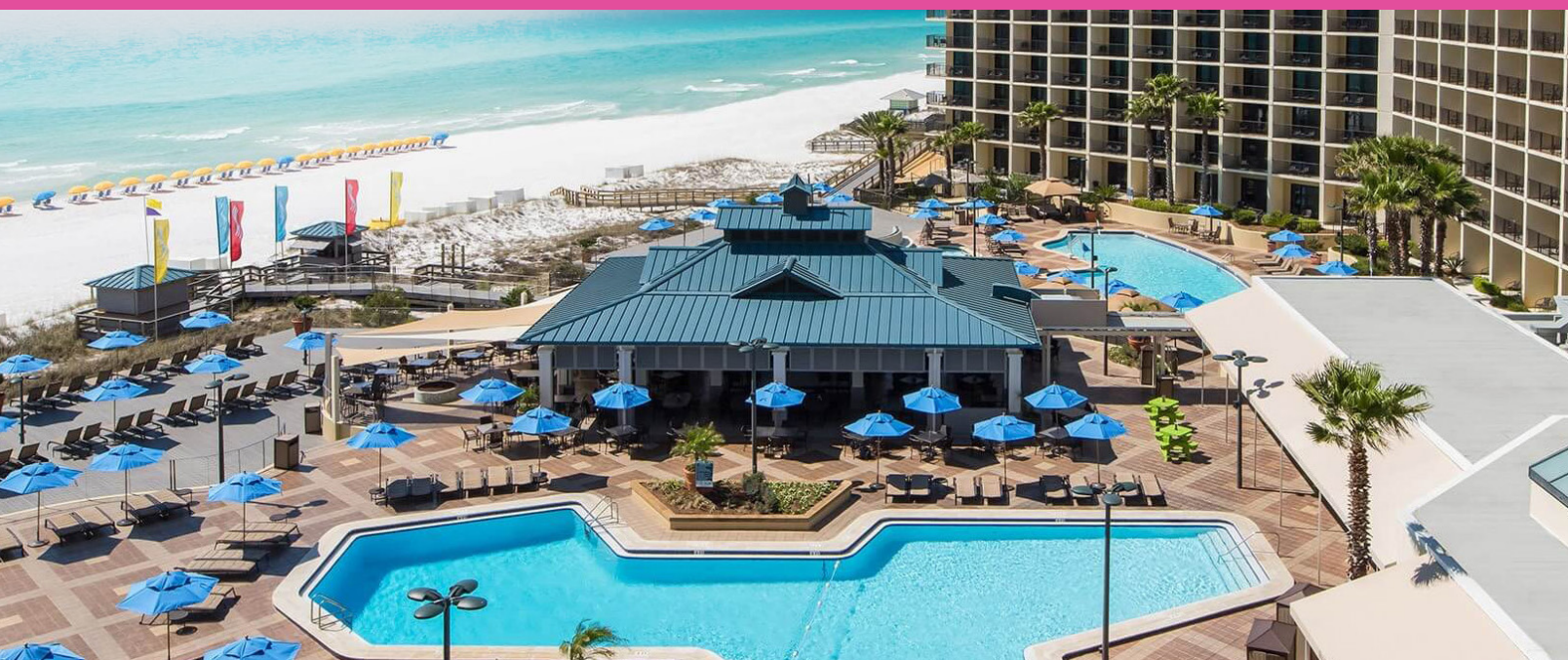
